## Adult Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA)



## "We all have a migration story: Fostering a culture of encounter"

We each have a migration story; a story of how our ancestors, or we ourselves, came to this land. Maori trace their ancestry or whakapapa to the 'waka' upon which their ancestors arrived in New Zealand. As Catholics we trace the migration story of our Church in New Zealand through the arrival in the 1820's of Catholic settlers, followed by Bishop Pompallier and the Society of Mary priests and brothers who arrived from France in 1838, landing first at Hokianga where they were welcomed by the 'tangata whenua', the people of the land.

Today New Zealand is a home shared by people from over 180 different ethnicities. Some arrive from war torn countries, forced to leave their homes due to violence and war. Others come permanently or temporarily to support their family and work for a better life. All have come to New Zealand looking for opportunities for a more decent and hope-filled future to share with loved ones.

We are moved by the stories of migrants and refugees who have come to New Zealand from situation of hardship and suffering. Hearing their stories demands we address the poverty, injustice and violence that makes leaving home necessary for many individuals and families.

We continue to support those newly arrived refugees and migrants as they establish themselves in their new surroundings in New Zealand. This Jubilee Year of Mercy challenges us to foster a culture of encounter. As newcomers join our communities, we have an opportunity to meet and encounter each other, to discover and celebrate the gifts that people from migrant and refugee backgrounds bring to our parishes, schools, and workplaces.
