

Feast of the Korean Martyrs

This Tuesday, 20th September, is the feast day of St's Andrew Kim Taegon, Paul Chong Hasang and Companions (the Korean Martyrs).

The story of the Korean Church is unique because it was founded in the 18th century entirely by lay people. It withstood wave after wave of fierce persecution and in less than a century 10,000 faithful had died as martyrs. The death of these martyrs became the leaven of the Church and led to today's splendid flowering of Catholicism in Korea. One of the martyrs and first Korean priest, Father Andrew Kim Taegon, was canonised by Pope John Paul II in 1984 and 124 were beatified by Pope Francis in 2014.

The Korean Catholic community in Wellington is based at St Mary of the Angels. They are truly a wonderful example of faith as they meet each Sunday in our Parish Hall after Mass for catechesis and prayer. Each year during the month of January when our regular choir is on holiday the Korean community lead the singing at the Choral Mass.

Please join with our Korean Community this Tuesday as we thank God for the witness of the Korean Martyrs and for the community here today who are such a vibrant and generous group in our Parish.
