3 June 2018, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The Chosen People were a broken people but God's mercy took them from slavery to freedom, from Egypt to the Promised Land. They remember this in the Passover celebration. The Eucharistic Feast, or Mass, in which we too, celebrate the saving deeds of God in our lives, is essential for us. It reminds us that he died and rose so that we be freed from sin. Not only does the Mass remind us but it also draws us into the ongoing process of freeing us, the members of the Body of Christ, from whatever enslaves us. Likewise, because we have the Body of Christ within us when we celebrate Mass, we are missioned to take the Risen Christ to wherever we come across the broken Body of Christ.

Each morning when we wake up it would be appropriate for each of us to ask these questions of Jesus: Help me to recognise your broken Body today? Help me to be your agent, to bring freedom and healing to this brokenness? Shall I find your broken body among the homeless or the sick? Shall I go to my own household or perhaps to someone from whom I need to seek forgiveness? Shall I look in my own workplace for the broken Body of Christ?

Sacred Heart of Jesus

Crudely put, Friday's Solemnity helps us to appreciate that Jesus is God with skin on. A previous Archbishop of Westminster, London, Cardinal Basil Hume, OSB, wrote once that the Sacred Heart makes divine love, human; interprets divine love in human language. Cardinal Hume also says that the feast of the Sacred Heart reveals the vulnerability of God. Perhaps we are used to thinking of God as unchanging and anything but vulnerable. But, we get a glimpse of God's vulnerability in God's Son: his reaction to the ingratitude of the nine lepers; his weeping over Jerusalem; his affection for Martha and Mary; his reaction to the betrayal by Judas. Again and again we meet a vulnerable Jesus in the Gospels. It seems that God became human to feel what we feel, to show that he understands.

So what can we make of the Sacred Heart. Surely it is the necessary connection of the head to the heart. If we have only knowledge and it is not integrated into our lives then we cannot love with the heart of Christ? Through faith-filled prayer and reflection we can become people of wisdom, aware of the tremendous love God has for each of us and use our knowledge to respond to people around us with charity, compassion, generosity, and with joy.
