

13 May 2018, The Ascension of the Lord

The Ascension and Christian Unity -Go and Teach all People my Gospel (Mt 28:19)

Gone are the days in Aotearoa New Zealand when Catholics and Christians from other denominations hardly mixed. I remember while as a student at St Teresa's School, Karori walking home from the bus stop and my heart sinking if I had to navigate my way through a group of boys from the local state school. In my early formative years, the reality was very different from John 17:20-26 where Jesus prays for those who believe in him that they be one just as the Father and Jesus are one. Life has changed greatly since those days in the 1960s with one positive development being the growth in the ecumenical movement.

The Resurrected Jesus had to Ascend to the Father in order for the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be sent by the Father, to teach us everything and remind us of all the Jesus had said. (John 14:25-26) The ecumenical movement is truly a work of the Holy Spirit who is slowly bringing unity to the believers of Jesus Christ. And it is slow for after all, although Christians share so much in common there is much that divides us. The power of the Holy Spirit, prayer, dialogue, mutual respect, faith and patience are needed in abundance to bring about unity in Christ.

From 13–20 May we are invited to pray for Christian unity. At each Sunday Mass we will be praying the Prayer for Christian Unity and you are invited to pray the prayer at home as well. Also, at this time of the year we have the opportunity to participate in the traditional combined Pentecost service on the 20th May at 7.30pm at St John's in the City, corner Willis and Dixon Streets. This service will bring together Christians from the faith communities of St Peter's Anglican Church, St John's Presbyterian Church and ourselves for a time of prayer, reflection and song.

Prayer for Christian Unity Week

As people of the new covenant, sealed in the blood of your Son, our Lord Iesus Christ we turn to you, O God, for renewed strength to more faithfully witness the unity of your family. We seek the healing touch of your mercy, O Loving God, glorious in your power, that we might walk with greater trust the way of peace. Help us to put aside the differences that do not matter, while honouring the diversity that blesses your all-embracing love. Move us forward, hand in hand, that your covenant of peace might be the cause of unity for your people and the whole world. In the name of Jesus, who prayed that all might be one.
