#### The Role of a Deacon

Father Barry has asked me to write something for the Angelus today about my role as a Deacon at St Marys.

The basic role of a deacon is to serve. The very word "deacon" is taken from the Greek word diakonia, meaning service. Exactly what a deacon does varies depending upon the needs of those he serves. However there are three main areas of service; the Word, the Liturgy and Charity.

At Mass, the deacon is the ordinary minister of the proclamation of the Gospel (in fact, a priest, bishop, or even the Pope should not proclaim the Gospel if a deacon is present) His ministry also includes preaching and teaching. His liturgical ministry includes various parts of the Mass proper to the deacon, including being an ordinary minister of Holy His ministry of charity involves Communion. service to the poor and marginalized and working with parishioners to help them become more involved in such ministry. As clerics, they are required to recite the Liturgy of the Hours. Deacons, like priests and bishops, are ordinary ministers of the sacrament of Baptism and can serve as the church's witness at the sacrament of Holy Matrimony. Deacons may preside at funeral rites not involving a Mass. They can preside over various services such as Benediction and they may give certain blessings. They cannot hear confession and give absolution, anoint the sick, or celebrate Mass.

For myself I am unable to fulfill all the roles of a deacon at this parish (e.g. ministry of charity to the poor) as I am a full time student at the college of education, studying to become a teacher. Also I am a transitional deacon as opposed to a permanent deacon. This means that I am on the path to priestly ordination within the Society of Mary. I am hoping to get ordained in September up in my home parish of Whangarei.

Thank you for all your support and encouragement since I have been here. Your feedback about my homilies is very much appreciated. Please pray for me as I approach ordination (not to mention my exams!!)
