The Return to 'Ordinary Time'

The Church year is ordered into major seasons: Advent which prepares us for Christmas and Lent in preparation for Easter. The time in-between these is named 'Ordinary time' which strictly speaking means 'in the normal order of things'. The weeks of Ordinary Time allow us to focus in an ordered way on feast days and solemnities in the Church's calendar and to recognize in our Liturgies, specific dates and events which are important to our own community. While the major liturgical seasons are a wonderful gift to us, the return to Ordinary Time allows us to think about the riches and blessings we have in our lives, every day.

Anniversary Day Holiday

Tomorrow Monday 24 January is a Public Holiday and Mass will be celebrated in our Church at 9am. Our normal weekly timetable resumes from Tuesday 25 January. Daily Masses: 7.30am, 12.05pm and 5.15pm.

Mass on Waitangi Day

This year Waitangi Day falls on Sunday 6 February. We will celebrate its significance during the 11am Mass. We will be joined at this Mass by the Maori people from Te Kainga at Kilbirnie and Te Ngakau Tapu from Porirua. Our Director of Music, Robert Oliver, has been working with these groups preparing the music and singing for this Mass.






