


If your vehicle is locked in, you must contact the Presbytery NOT the Dominion Post.

Lituray Notes

It is ten weeks since the introduction of the new wording for the people's responses in the Liturgy. While most of the spoken responses are already becoming familiar, the wording and the musical setting of the Gloria, are proving to



be much more challenging. It may help to know that of all the changes in the Liturgy wording, parishes throughout the country report a similar experience with respect to learning the Gloria. This is to be expected, given that the new wording was introduced for Advent when, in preparation for Christmas, the Gloria is not said. Neither is the Gloria said during the season of Lent as we prepare for Easter. Our initial appreciation of this new setting is therefore likely to be formed over a period when the opportunity to listen and learn it, is limited.

It is common in Catholic Church tradition for the Liturgy to be expressed in a range of musical settings and the more frequently we hear and participate in the Mass, the more familiar these settings become. Over the next few weeks our Church musicians will be paying particular attention to the new Gloria at each Mass. We appreciate their leadership in this, particularly as they too have had limited time to learn the new settings.
