

Sitting in Companionship

"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful," begins one of the oldest and most loved Catholic prayers to the Holy Spirit. It is simple and it works. If you invite the Holy Spirit into your heart, the invitation will not be ignored and you will have a companion, quite literally, for life.

We are a practical people; we like things to work. If we have asked a question, we would like an answer. If others are in distress, we want to help and if something is broken, we want it fixed. We can live with mess and uncertainty but we prefer to have things sorted out.

Given these traits of our national character, it is understandable that the themes of a people tormented by thirst finding Living Water and the love of God being poured into hearts that are hardened, are deeply reassuring. It also prompts a question that comes up throughout the Scriptures, "What must I do?" The short answer to this is not so much 'do' as 'be'. We don't need to even ask; if we simply listen our hearts will be opened.

Listening and 'being present' is the gift of companionship and is one of the characteristics of our Church Guardians, who sit each day in companionship with Christ, present in the Tabernacle. Simply by being there, they allow the Church to remain open for others to visit. It is impossible to know what movements of the heart happen in people and in our world when we allow ourselves to be open to the Holy Spirit. What we can know is that we are changed by being with Christ.


