



## Pastoral Letter to the Archdiocese

Archbishop John Dew has asked that a Pastoral Letter be read at all Masses today. In his covering note he is mindful that he does not want to interrupt the Lenten reflective time but the letter contains important issues regarding future decisions that need to be made in the Archdiocese. The letter is published in full on page three of this month's issue of the WELCOM.

#### Stations of the Cross

Stations of the Cross are prayed in our Church each Friday evening during Lent after the 5.15pm Mass. It is a very prayerful and appropriate liturgy on a Friday (the day of which Jesus died) as we walk with him on his journey to Calvary.

We are all very aware of the pain, suffering and death as a result of the earthquake in Christchurch. Liz Pearce, a pastoral worker in the Rotorua Parish has given voice to New Zealand's greatest natural disaster by preparing: 'The Christchurch Stations of the Cross'.

These have appeared in the April edition of the Marist Messenger and will be prayed using our Data Projector and appropriate music next Friday evening 8 March after the 5.15pm Mass.



# Lenten Reflection - Week Four



Lord Jesus, you accept our humanity. Lord, have mercy. Lord Jesus, you open our eyes to the needs of each other. Christ have mercy. Lord Jesus, with you we are children of light.

Lord have mercy.

The tradition of singing the Passion story began in the early centuries of the Christian church. To add solemnity to Holy Week services, Priests would chant the appointed Gospel account rather than simply read it and by the 13th century, these intonations had developed into dramatic narrations with soloists playing the key roles.

A beautiful Good Friday liturgy which developed in this tradition is that of meditating on the 'seven last words of Christ'. These 'last words' are the final seven phrases spoken by Christ from the Cross as reported in the Gospels.

### "The Seven Last Words"

Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do. Luke 23:33-34 Today you will be with me in Paradise. Luke 23:39-43 Woman, here is your son. John 19:25-27

My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? Mark 15:33-34 I am thirsty. John 19:28

It is finished. John 19:29-30

Father, into your hands I commend my Spirit. Luke 23:46

The Fourth Sunday in Lent is also known as 'Rose Sunday' and offers a glimmer of the glory of Easter, still two weeks away. The Gospel reflects the promise that through Jesus we can overcome spiritual blindness and the darkness of sin. Implicit in this, is the invitation to each of us to walk as children of light.

Our prayer for this week might be:

O Holy Spirit....Replace the tension within, with holy relaxation. Replace the turbulence with a sacred calm. Replace anxiety with a quiet confidence. Replace the fear with a strong faith. Replace the darkness with a gentle light. Replace the bitterness with the sweetness of your Grace. Replace the coldness within with a gentle warmth.

O my loving Jesus, by the power of your Spirit make of me, a 'praise of glory' to the Father. Amen.
