Are We There Yet?

The story of Martha, Mary and Lazarus is not solely one of resurrection from the dead but the story of the manifestation of the power of God at work in Jesus. Mary and Martha were highly anxious about Lazarus and they wanted Jesus to 'hurry up'. Jesus was deeply moved. He wept at the news Lazarus had died and he did what he tells us to do - trust God.

In some respects each of us is Lazarus; powerless save for the prayers of others Each of us has something from which we want to be set free and each of us, through 'prayers of the faithful', has someone praying for us whether we are aware of it or not.

These last weeks of Lent are bringing us towards Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week with the pain of the Passion and the promise made real, of the Resurrection.

Although we are not there yet, we know there is much to celebrate in our faith community. At the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, we will welcome into the Church, those who have been making their way towards Christ through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Eucharist. The RCIA programme which began in August has been a major commitment for the Elect and their Sponsors, their families and friends. We have held them in our prayers and continue to do so.

The Easter Vigil is truly something to celebrate, not just for our new Catholics but for each of us; a new beginning. To mark this event, I invite those who want to celebrate the 'end of the beginning' with the RCIA Elect and their families to a special Supper in the Parish Hall immediately after the Easter Vigil.

I need two volunteers to help with the preparation of the supper to welcome our new Catholics. If you can help, please contact me.





Out Of The Depths: Abortion and Reconciliation

Not everyone feels guilty about abortion; some are simply numb. The following story highlights one woman's journey from her experience of abortion to a new experience of God's grace. After taking her abortion to Confession three times, she finally connected with the reality of the Sacrament she had received: Reconciliation.

She writes: It began very soon after the actual abortion. I didn't really know what to do but I wanted to somehow leave the story of this child somewhere safe. So I went to Confession and left my story there. I didn't know how the Priest would react. I was deeply sorry, but I wasn't really sure whether I was sorry about the abortion or whether I was sorry that I felt slightly relieved. Much later, I realised what a turning point this was. The Priest asked me if I had a name for this child, which I only then realised, I did.

In later years, I took my abortion story to Confession again and again. The abortion still hadn't gone away - it was always with me and over time I realised I had begun to feel a deep sense of resentment about everyone and everything. Though I didn't realise it at the time, each experience of Confession and Reconciliation was like a stepping stone which put me into a better place to make the next move. Just saying "Sorry," even when I didn't feel it, allowed something to shift within me.

When the first Priest asked if I had a name, the child became a reality to me, even if I couldn't say 'my child' until years later. The second Priest told me that I am still the same person God created out of love and always would be, though my life would certainly have been different if I had made other choices. I didn't recognise what a gift this was for quite a few years. The third time was when I understood what it was to go from Confession to Reconciliation. At the words of absolution, the Priest called me "Sister" and I crumpled. Confession you "do" but Reconciliation you "know". There's a big difference.

Knowledge of an abortion never goes away, but I feel it no longer overshadows me. Instead, I carry with me a sense of the child I turned away from all those years ago and a very mixed sense of happiness and deep regret for who he or she might have been. While I still don't connect particularly with the idea of motherhood, this is beginning to change and I have a strong sense of wanting to protect something vulnerable that has been entrusted to me. I wouldn't call it maternal instinct exactly, but it's definitely a feeling I didn't know I had in me.
