

Celebrations of Holy Week

Holy Week begins today with the Commemoration of the Lord's triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. As we prepare to process into the Church today with our Palm branches we will hear the following words:

"Christ entered in triumph into his own city, to complete his work as our Messiah: to suffer, to die and to rise again. Let us remember with devotion this entry which began his saving work and follow him with a lively faith. United with Christ in his suffering on the Cross may we share his resurrection and

Matthew's Gospel provides a dramatic eye-witness description of the Passion events. Although he wrote for an audience with a good knowledge of Jewish Scripture and custom, his words are as profound and as poignant to us today as they were to the first Christians. There is no escaping the reality of this week. The public acclaim Jesus received, the Institution of the Eucharist, the brutality of his betrayal and public abuse, his obedience even to death and his triumphal resurrection into glory are truly the elements of our salvation.

Welcoming our New Catholics

The Easter Vigil on Saturday night marks the time when those Candidates and Catechumens who have been making their 'pilgrim way' through the RCIA programme will be welcomed into our Parish family through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion. These faithful men and women are a great gift to all of us. They bring all their experience of life, family and friendships, and now, after instruction, prayer and reflection, they commit themselves to union with Christ through the Sacraments of the Church.

I hope that as many parishioners as possible will join us to welcome these new Catholics into our community. There will be supper in the Parish Hall after the Easter Vigil and all are welcome. Please bring a plate to help with the refreshments - the Hall will be open before the Vigil.




