Mystagogy: Journeying deeply into the Sacraments

The Church often refers to the period of ifty days that pass between the Easter Vigil and Pentecost as Mystagogy, a time when those who have been initiated into the Church are encouraged to 'journey nore deeply into the Sacraments'.

This is an important time for everyone; those new to the Church as well as those who are reconciled, participate in the Eucharist and renew Baptismal promises.



It is hard to appreciate the richness of the spiritual resources that exist in the Church to help us grow in prayer and holiness and knowledge of God. Though Christianity does not depend on spiritual techniques, it does offer guidance and assistance in developing a life of prayer and in putting that prayer into action as a life of love.

Pope Benedict's encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est* talks specifically about this, while the last chapter of John Paul II's last book, *Memory and Identity*, encourages everyone to search for 'deeper Christianity' in their lives. John Paul explains that observing the Commandments (Matt 19:16-17) enables us to discover and live our fundamental values. "These values," he says, "are lights that illuminate the beauty of our existence. This beauty becomes a light for our actions so that we are able to live in the truth." As examples, observing the commandment, "You shall not kill," we learn a profound respect for life. By not committing adultery we acquire the virtue of purity. Rather than being something negative, this creates in us a growing awareness of the beauty of our humanity.

"Famous Last Words"

The seven 'last words' or more accurately phrases, said by Christ on the Cross are recorded collectively in the Gospels. They are a source of great reflection. Among them, "My God, why have you abandoned me?" speaks right to the heart of anyone at crisis point. In some things, there is simply no way out and no help visible.

A woman involved in family counseling, particularly for those whose lives have been touched by abortion, made these comments about the importance of 'last words.'

"News of unexpected pregnancy usually brings plenty of advice. Some of it helpful like, "We love you and we will love this child who is with you." A person in crisis is likely to translate this as, "We love you.' Other advice sounds good until it is spoken in reality. "We'll support whatever you decide to do." Translation: 'you are on your own.' The path to an abortion usually begins long before a woman is pregnant or at crisis point. What she hears in her heart she will likely recall in her crisis."

Prayer: Lord, send your Word deep into my heart.




