

If your vehicle is locked in, you must contact the Presbytery



Next week we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, the moment when the Apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit and from when they were able to set about their mission of evangelisation. We might regard this event as the birthday of the Church, the moment from when the Church was created and has ever since continued to 'renew the face of the earth'.

Among the things that amazed those early witnesses to the events of Pentecost was the ability to hear and understand in their own language, what the Spirit-filled Apostles were saying. The Word of God, made real and at work in the lives of these ordinary folk, must have been a wonderfully lively experience.

Next week for the Feast of Pentecost, we encourage everyone to come to Mass dressed in their National Costume. One of the great joys of being an inner-city Parish is the friendship we have with our Christian neighbours. At Pentecost each year, the Parishes of St Mary of the Angels (Catholic), St John's (Presbyterian) and St Peter's (Anglican) gather to share a Pentecost Liturgy. This year St Peter's on Willis Street is to host the Ecumenical Pentecost Service at 7pm. Please make an effort to attend if you can. It is a special event in our Parish calendar and those who participate are rewarded with a deeper appreciation of the Christianity each tradition embodies.


