



## Choir Open Day

Next Sunday afternoon 19 June from 2:30pm—3:30pm the Choir will have an Open Day in the Church. What is it, and why have one?

It begins with a performance of some of the music the choir has been singing in its role of providing the music for the Mass. There will also be contributions from our organist, David Trott, our organ scholar, Emmanuel Godinez, two of our very good sopranos will sing some duets, and the childrens' choir, Young Angel Voices, will sing. There will also be pieces for the audience to take part in, in short, an hour of beautiful music and some fun.

This will be followed by an opportunity to visit the organ loft, meet our organists, find out a little about the wonderful Maxwell Fernie Organ, and view Greg O'Brien's illustrated poems 'The non-singing seats' which he donated to the choir and which hang on the organ case.

Everyone is then invited to come downstairs, to view some of the material we use - the chant sheets, the liturgical books, and the music that we sing every week at Mass - and to join us for a cup of tea and ask the questions you've always wanted to ask.

Why have one at all? It's a midwinter Festival of Song – a few days before the shortest day of the year. Our choir is one of the older musical institutions in New Zealand, and this proud tradition is worth putting on show every so often, to the wider community as well as our congregation at 11am Mass. However familiar with the music, this offers a chance to learn more about it. It has also been advertised around the region, so the wider public are welcome. We will have copies of the choir CD for sale, and if anyone wants to make a contribution to the Parish Music Fund they are most welcome to do





## Reflection: Understanding Loss, Grief and Bereavement

The 'Seasons for Growth' programme which explores the effects of change in our lives is a Ministry of the Catholic Church, developed in Australia and widely used in parishes throughout New Zealand.

The programme can be described as an educational

support group—a tool for understanding the effects of loss, grief and bereavement. Seasons explores the four tasks of grieving in the context of what we observe in nature:

Autumn: accepting the reality of change and loss;

Winter: experiencing the pain of grief;

Spring: adjusting to an environment in which the person, object or situation is no longer present;

Summer: the healthy re-investment of emotional energy, a way forward.

While grief is a part of every life, it is often regarded as something associated primarily with death, leaving other significant life-changing events unrecognised and grieved in unhealthy or unsuccessful ways. The programme incorporates knowledge about change and grief consistent with the adult experience of life, such as changes to income or work, living situations, physical ability or access to friends.

Thinking about loss, apart from and as well as in the context of the death of a loved one, allows us to re-consider perhaps with greater joy, all that we have in our lives today and to discover a new sense of gratitude for the experiences which have shaped us thus far.

There are two opportunities to participate in a Seasons programme in the next few weeks; one a Retreat weekend and one a series of four evenings for individuals. Both offer a safe learning experience.
