





# Reflection: Reuniting Refugee Families

The Refugee Family Reunification Trust is urgently seeking funds to help reunite several families in Wellington. These families need help with the cost of the airfares to bring their remaining family members, including young children, to join them here. Most of these families have been torn apart by war and their circumstances as refugees, and have often spent many years in refugee camps in Ethiopia, Kenya or Sudan. In many cases, they have not seen each other for years.



In the past ten years, the Trust has helped more than 320 refugees join their families in Wellington. The Trust works with a number of other agencies involved with refugees, including Catholic Social Services and St Vincent de Paul's Society.

Cardinal Thomas Williams, one of the Trust's Patrons reflected "It is intrinsic in human nature to be in relationships with each other and family relationships are the most important of them all. Belonging to a family provides a sense of identity, security and worth. For refugees when their family members are far away and possibly in danger, the distance and uncertainty is extremely distressing. Until the family is reunited, it is very difficult for refugees to move on and integrate fully into the new society. It is not enough to agree that the right to be with one's family is among the most fundamental of all human rights. As the costs of bringing family members to New Zealand are very high, refugees need financial help to make family reunification possible. The Trust is a splendid example of "walking the talk".
