



Stewardship Institute

On August 27 and 28 Archbishop John will host a Stewardship Institute at St Patrick's College Kilbirnie. Articles in the Wel-com newspaper this year have discussed various aspects of stewardship, the basis of collaborative and vibrant parish and community life.

The Stewardship Institute will examine the vision of stewardship as a way of life under the guidance of American family specialists Ed and April Laughlin.

Day one will look at the theology and spirituality of stewardship, how it speaks of gratitude, responsibility, generosity and increase and how it fuels ministry and evangelisation. The theme for day two is 'Stewardship in Action' and searches out signs of successful stewardship, what forming and nurturing leadership means and creates some steps for growth in stewardship.

On Friday 27 August there will be PRAY/LIVE at the Cathedral to pray for the success of the Institute.

Enrolment forms are available at the Parish Office. The cost is \$220 for the weekend and if you want to attend the dinner on the Saturday evening the extra cost is \$40.
