





Reflection: Moses

The statue of Moses by St Joseph's Chapel in St Mary of the Angels, is a marble replica, one third the size of the Michelangelo original in Rome. It creates much comment, particularly from visitors.

Moses appears seated, stone tablets under his arm and somewhat alarmingly, he seems to have horns emerging from his head. This was the normal Western medieval depiction of Moses where translations from the Hebrew variously described him as appearing with a halo or with horns, a symbol of authority in Near Eastern culture.



Recent weekday Mass Readings are drawn from Exodus and feature Moses, one of the great Old Testament prophets. They tell of the events that brought the Jewish people out of slavery in Egypt, God's gift of the Ten Commandments, the experience of God being with his people as they travelled through the desert, and of his love for them when they needed food to eat. The covenant God made with his people in the desert is the same for us today; he is our God and we are his people and he will never abandon us. All this, Moses witnessed.
