

#### SUNDAY MASS PARKING





#### Reflection: Christchurch Prayer Vigil

The candle vigil in front of Our Lady's Altar in St Mary of the Angels links us directly with all that has happened in Christchurch. The broken pieces of stonework and the muddy and torn music manuscript were collected from inside the Catholic Basilica of the Blessed Sacrament and brought to St Mary of the Angels, as a symbol of prayer. Those with a sharp eye, will note the choir music is for the Mass setting *De Angelis*, the setting usually sung at the 11am Sunday Mass in this Church.

It seems the near-constant rumblings of earthquake are to be a way of life for Christchurch, for some time.

It will soon be 4 September and one year since the first, shocking earthquake that woke Canterbury to

a morning of disbelief. On that day, there was a sense of nationwide bewilderment that Christchurch could be so damaged, yet no lives lost. In those early days visitors to the city could walk around, looking for signs of what had been reported. "Christchurch looks more or less the same, but it feels different," commented one.

The word 'liquefaction' entered the language and whole communities began to live with uncertainty. A lot has happened since then. Further quakes and tremors, unbelievably numbering in the thousands, and then the 22 February earthquake that took buildings, homes, businesses and lives. The city centre was cordoned off and officials, planners, emergency services and community support workers who had already 'gone the extra mile', began to re-think the reality of recovery, rebuilding and resilience.

By all accounts, the earthquake on 13 June crumbled the last hopes of things ever being what they once were and those angry or defiant became resigned to a slow grief.

Those who remain, those who live and work in Christchurch are changed. It is hard to find anyone who doesn't carry a water bottle, a cell phone and an MP3 player so they would have access to the radio. The earthquakes continue, the help, prayers and support are still needed.

We remain mindful of Christchurch. As we offer our prayers and our hymns, we reflect on the human dimension to natural disaster and pray for those who bear the scars in their own lives.
