If your vehicle is locked in, you must contact the Presbytery






Topic: "Reading the Bible in the time of Father Colin and Bishop



Reflection: They Saw His Glory

Recent Mass readings have included the Transfiguration of Jesus, the event reported in Matthew (17:1-9, Mark 9:2 -28, Luke 9:28-36 and 2 Peter 1: 16-18) in which his divine nature is revealed to three of the Apostles.

According to these accounts Jesus, accompanied by Peter, James and John, go to pray in quiet at the top of a mountain. Once there, Jesus becomes transfigured before them; his face shining as the sun, and his garments white as the light. The prophets Moses and Elijah appear next to him and they speak together. A voice then says "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him". When the disciples fall to the ground in fear, Jesus touches -

them, telling them not to be afraid. The disciples look up. They no longer see Elijah or Moses, but they recognise the voice. It is God the Father, who spoke similarly at the Baptism of Jesus.

The Transfiguration is a powerful miracle, unique in that it happens to Jesus himself. Thomas Aquinas describes the Transfiguration as, "the greatest miracle" in that it complemented Jesus' baptism and showed the perfection of life in Heaven.

In Church teaching, the Transfiguration reveals a crucial point about the truly Divine nature of Christ. The mountain setting presents a point where human nature meets God: a meeting place for the temporal and the eternal, with Jesus the bridge between heaven and earth.

The words in the Transfiguration, "listen to him", identifies Jesus as God's messenger and mouth-piece. The presence of Elijah and Moses, in their own right recognised and revered, underlines the closeness of the relationship Jesus has with God the Father. He is the Son, and speaks with divine authority.

Lord, grant us a new vision of your glory, a new experience of your power, a new faithfulness to your Word. Amen
