





Reflection: the Queenship of Mary (22 August)

'Queen of Heaven' the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary is very familiar in Catholic teaching and the inspiration for some of the most beautiful prayers of intercession ever composed.

The title, first given at the Council of Ephesus in the fifth century, when the Blessed Virgin Mary was proclaimed as theotokos ("God-bearer," or "birth-giver of God"). In Latin: Mater Dei. "Mother of God".

Throughout the ages, recognition of Our Lady, Queen of Heaven has encouraged devotion, expressed in prayer, theology, literature and liturgies. The Liturgy of the Hours (or Divine Office) for example, is a prayerful discipline practiced today by Consecrated religious and the

In more recent times, Pope Pius XII proclaimed the Queenship of Mary in his 1954 encyclical Ad Caeli Regina, recognising her special place in our salvation history.

Noted as a theologian, Pope Benedict XVI has endorsed Mary's place in Heaven saying her humble and unconditional acceptance of God's will is a model for all ages. "God exalted her over all other creatures, and Christ crowned her Oueen of Heaven and Earth."

Apart from the 'Hail Mary', the 'Salve Regina' (Hail Holy Queen) is one of the most oft-recited prayers to Our Lady, asking her help in bringing us to Christ.

Salve Regina, Mater Misericordiae, vita, dulcedo, et spes nostra, salve!

Ad te clamamus, exsules filii Hevae, ad te suspiramus, gementes et flentes, In hac lacrimarum valle. Eia ergo, Advocata nostra, Illos tuos misericordes oculos ad nos converte.
