





## Adult Education in the Faith at St. Mary of the Angels

In response to an initiative of the Provincial Administration of the Society of Mary in New Zealand and with the support of the Parish Pastoral Council of St. Mary of the Angels, regular adult education in the faith sessions are planned for the parish next year.

The impetus for this project accords with a call from the General Administration of the Society of Mary to develop the mission of inner city churches administered by the Society of Mary and with the strategic plan of the Parish Pastoral

Council of St. Mary of the Angels to enrich the faith and spirituality of parishioners. The impetus also enables me to "put into practice" a long held desire to offer regular parish-based mystagogical catechesis for the baptised.

At this stage, I hope to begin next year one reasonably regular session per week of Adult Education in the Faith on a day and time that is, at present, in the process of being finalised.

In the months ahead, I hope to give you regular up-dates in the Angelus on the progress of this proposed project.


Any expression of interest would be helpful and greatly appreciated to gauge the usefulness and viability of such a project.


## Live below the Line - on now!
