

Now that approval has been received from Rome on the full text (both in English and Maori) the Missal can be printed.

responses that the people have been using these past few months. While it will take some time to recognize and remember the new words they will eventually become part of our memory and before too long we will know them well. # Reflection: Creativity and Being Created

The potter moulding the clay, forming, reshaping and then firing it, reminds us that our lives too are being purposefully shaped by God.

Suffering is a part of life and reshaping is often painful. Christ himself emphasizes this, not only in his teaching but by all that he suffered in his own life.

If we are to accept the humanity of Jesus, we need to be open to being refashioned which involves suffering as well as joy.



"As the clay is in the Potter's hands, so are you in mine." Jeremiah 18:6

The necessary pain of being re-formed is a particularly poignant theme for those in Christchurch, as today marks the first anniversary of the Canterbury earthquakes. As residents wake each day to ruin, they also wake to discussion and planning about re-building. Advisors from other parts of the world which have emerged from destruction paint a cautious but encouraging future. They encourage people to gather and talk, to think about what really matters to them and what the physical

environment will be like for their communities. Consistently high on

the wish-list of the urban designs submitted so far are spaces for people

to gather and simply enjoy being with each other.



While many first-time visitors to Wellington for the WOW (the World of Wearable Arts) delight at the colours, creativity, design and sheer impracticality of the exhibits, veteran patrons often comment on the surprise of finding fresh ideas presented every year.

For those who strive to exhibit year after year, each time promising, "this really is the last time," their inspiration is often drawn from their experience of being among like-minded people. A comment from one of this year's judges points to a deeper truth. "It's an amazing thing to realise there is simply no end to imagination. We each somehow have this truly God-given capacity for joy."
