

Looking ahead

With only five weeks until the Feast of Christ the King signalling the end of the Church's liturgical year, we might reflect on how little time there is to accomplish all that we might wish, before the beginning of Advent.

New Mass Missal: On the first Sunday in Advent, the revised English translation of the Roman Missal will be fully introduced throughout New Zealand. The people's responses were introduced at Advent last year and the revised Missal completes the changes. The people's responses are now familiar to you but you will notice significant changes to the Eucharistic prayers and the prayers which the Celebrant will pray.

All Saints Day Vespers: The Choir of St Mary of the Angels will once again sing Vespers for the Feast of All Saints, at 7.30pm on Tuesday 1 November. This beautiful and reflective evening prayer has been a tradition in our Church for some years and all are warmly invited to participate.

Mass of Remembrance (Holy Souls): all those who have died are remembered especially during the month of November. At the 5.15pm Mass on Thursday 10th November, we will remember in particular, those who have been buried in the last year from St Mary of the Angels Church. Last year at this time we learnt of the tragic loss of 29 lives in the Pike River Mine and since then earthquakes in Christchurch have claimed many more. These losses are also remembered.

Carol Services: as we prepare for Christmas and to receive Christ, vulnerable as an infant child, we have the opportunity to join the choirs of St John's Presbyterian and St Mary of the Angels on Sunday 4 December for the *Combined Carol Service* and on Wednesday 14 December the very popular *Carols with the Angels* in our own Church.



Reflection: Learning about Christ.

The word 'spirituality' cannot be easily defined because it covers every aspect of our lives in relation to our experience of the transcendent which, for Christians, refers to our experience of God as revealed and interpreted in and through Christ.

Christian spirituality has its beginnings in the desire expressed in the words, "Come and see" (John 1:39) that leads to the effort required in the words "Follow me" (John 1:43). Desire motivates; effort initiates a change in us in the way we see and come to know our selves in and through the relationships we have and develop with others and with God over time. Desire, then, found in the words, "Come and see" is the mother of hope and the effort required inherent in the words, "Follow me" is called conversion or *metanoia* – the turning and the shaping of the whole person toward and into one who loves God and neighbour as oneself.

Ultimately, Christian spirituality develops our deepening response to the question asked by Christ of his disciples, "Who do you say I am?" It is not simply an understanding *about* Christ ("Who do *people* say I am?") but how each of us will answer Christ individually and personally when he asks of us, "But you, who do *you* say I am?" (Mark 8: 27, 29). Spirituality reveals the conviction inherent in our relationship to Christ as disciple to Master or Lord.

Because spirituality involves the desire and effort to change and grow in our relationship with God, others and also in the way we see (that is, relate) to our own selves, spirituality is often described in terms of a *journey* – a journey over time; over a whole *life*-time. Spirituality is never static. It can, however, stagnate when effort becomes complacent and desire grows cold. In other words, our journey can stop prematurely. Such a premature cessation of spiritual growth could be described as spiritual "heart-attack" or seizure which could destroy, but certainly damages, the healthy relationships spirituality seeks to produce in us with God and with others; a cardiac arrest or seizure that could lead to a spiritual parting of the ways expressed in Scripture through the words, "After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him" (John 6:66).

Growing in the spiritual life, then, is not just an "extra" to the life of faith; spirituality is the life-blood coursing through our spiritual arteries and veins in the everyday way in which we live and breathe our Christian lives. To ensure desire neither wanes nor effort grow coarse through complacency, the study of our understanding and experience of spirituality becomes a vital element in "bringing together" the many aspects of our lives into an integrated whole that reflects purpose and gives meaning to the way we, as Christians, relate to God, others and to our own selves in healthy, life-giving and, ultimately, "godly" ways.
