

Reflection: Guy Fawkes and all that

There's an apocryphal piece of graffiti which appeared on the stonewalls around the Palace of Westminster in London. It read, "Vote for Guy Fawkes—the only man to enter Parliament with honest intentions." While not wishing to diminish the dignity of the General Election soon to be held in this country, there is something to be learned from such saucy



wit. The historic arguments which led to the Gunpowder Plot of 1605 the plan by explosives expert Guy Fawkes and associates to assassinate the King by blowing up the entire Parliament, have long since given way to the increasingly commercial celebration of bonfires with fireworks. This is quite probably, as it should be. Attempting to settle political arguments through terrorism, irrespective of how deeply or widely held the beliefs, is unlikely to create a society characterised by tolerance and respect.

The same cannot be said, however, of the secular trend to reframe Christian feasts and solemnities as commercial opportunities. The eve of the feasts of All Saints and the Holy Souls would be replaced with the ghoulish extortions of Halloween were it not for ordinary Christians practicing their faith. Likewise the movement to diminish Christmas into a 'happy holiday' and Advent into a frenzy of pre-Christmas sales. Benedict XVI is astute to all this. In his World Youth Day address in Madrid, he challenged young people to confront secular culture. "Europe needs to rediscover its Christian roots," he said. He was more explicit in Sydney: "Wherever individuals and nations accept God's presence, worship him in truth and listen to his voice, the civilization of love is being built, a civilization in which the dignity of all is respected. The Church in Oceania is preparing for a new evangelization of peoples who today are hungering for Christ.

Amidst the clamour of end-of-year functions, Christmas Parties and cash registers, it may be difficult to prepare for the Christ-child. This is why we have Advent, a time to reflect on what drives our hunger and what feeds our soul.
