



The Solemnity of Christ the King



It's probable that people's expectations of kingly virtue are mainly based on stories from history books, novels, plays, poetry and movies. The characteristics of Kings include nobility, courage, power, leadership, talent and riches. Being human, some have failed ignobly to fulfil these ideals.

Christ's Kingship, which we celebrate today, the last Sunday of the liturgical year, is of a totally different order. Described in the encyclical (1925) *Quas Primas of Pope Pius XI*, the

Pontiff (who instigated today's celebration) says: "Christ has dominion over all creatures, a dominion not seized by violence nor usurped, but his by essence and by nature." Pope Benedict XVI notes Christ's Kingship is not based on "human power" but on loving and serving others.

St Paul, in his first letter to Timothy, thanks Christ for His patient forgiveness and mercy, saying: "To the king of ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory forever and ever" (1:1-17). St John also writes in the days immediately after Christ's baptism, that when Nathanael realises who Christ is, and says: Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" (1:49) Christ promises he will see Heaven open for him, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man. Kingship, in these verses of Scripture, speaks of the qualities of Christ whose riches are our salvation, His Kingdom, our future.

Despite this, Jesus Himself did not announce his own Kingship. During His trial, Matthew in his gospel says when the governor asked Jesus if He was the King of the Jews, he answered "You have said so." (Mt 27:11) (meaning he did not set Himself up as king against Caesar).

Nevertheless, Christians embrace Christ's sovereignty. St Paul writes to Timothy calling Jesus the "King of kings and the Lord of lords" (6:15) a title we celebrate today just as Christians did 2,000 years ago.
