





# Reflection: Suffering

I was speaking with a friend the other day about suffering and Lent. No one likes to suffer - that is why it is called suffering. My friend commented critically about why we add 'suffering' to our lives during Lent - why would we want any more!? Why should anybody?...

Compose in your imagination the whole people of Israel standing at the base of Mount Sinai who, three

months previously were freed from the slavery in Egypt. Moses has informed the people that God would be speaking to them very soon. Accompanied by thunder, lightning and trumpet blasts, a dense and dark cloud appears. Then the news everyone has been waiting to hear comes forth from the cloud. The news is comprised of ten commands which God wants carried out or else! More suffering!? The people don't like the sound-effects and light-show and beg Moses to talk directly to them - God is too much. Moses, in response, encourages them by explaining that God was getting their attention and wanted to make a deep impression on them about the importance of these laws. These commands cover most of our fallen-nature's tendencies. They are all about reverencing the Truth of God in everything. The question is about whether these are commandments to frighten us into submission, or invitations to the fullness of life.

This Lent, we pray for the desire to overcome our sins by prayer, fasting, and works of mercy. Fasting puts us in a delightful tension. On one side we experience our selfishness which is so attractive and demanding. On the other side is that dignified self which is not ruled by delights of all kinds and whenever. Fasting as a prayer is not a subtraction, or a 'giving up', but a receiving of a delightful truth; we are humans who have drives, instincts, tastes and fears to which we do not have to respond. Fasting, prayerfully done, offers us a sensitivity to our fallen humanity as well as the real nature of the delights of creation. By Larry Gillick
