

Wholeness, Healing and Jov

The desire for joy exerts a powerful pull.

It seems that to be contrary, is a characteristic set deep within our human nature. In the same way healing stems from hurt and a new experience of wholeness is possible from a place of brokenness, our longing for joy is sometimes revealed as the gift we 'don't ask for', but the one we most want.

Towards the end of June, there will be another Rachel's Vineyard Retreat weekend. The work of Rachel's Vineyard is to gather those whose lives have been touched by abortion and over the course of a weekend, allow them to find a new experience of wholeness. Mostly this involves the women who carry this experience, but increasingly the Retreat Team hears from men, grandparents and siblings who have no safe place to acknowledge their loss and resolve their grief.

The Retreat Team comprises a wide range of personal and professional experience and includes a facilitator, counsellor, Psychologist, Catholic Priest and a support person. Their role is to be with participants; they cannot be there for participants. No one can live another's experience nor truly understand how someone else feels, no matter what similarities might exist. Together, Retreat Team and Participants are a ministry of the Church; the hands and feet of Christ, a dwelling place of the Holy Spirit, a creation called into being by God.

Not that these triune notions are uppermost in the minds of Retreat Team or Participants as they gather to find their way through the chaos and grief that accompanies abortion.

There are three Retreats each year; March, June and November. The timing of the June Retreat is particularly poignant. As we experience the shortest day, we acknowledge those whose lives were the shortest lived; only a few weeks. What follows this shortest day, is lived experience of hope. From this weekend onwards, the days get longer and brighter. Our hope is that this weekend will be a turning point, a growing of the light for each participant too.

The **Friday Sunday Prayer** (to the right) offers a good insight into a Rachel's Vineyard Retreat. It was written by a woman over a Retreat weekend and has become a prayer others have picked up. "When I arrived on Friday, I didn't know what I was feeling," she says. "I don't naturally write about myself. While I was waiting for the others to arrive, I tried to put into words what I thought I was feeling, but all I managed were these scraps of phrases. When I looked at these words again on Sunday morning, I realised that what I had written on Friday was no longer true, so I re-wrote them. It was only when I put the two attempts together, that I saw what the Friday to Sunday journey had been for me. I realised that God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit is my experience of God, and this awareness has been with me ever since. I probably look the same on the outside, but on the inside, I feel I am being fuelled by this quietly burning coal of joy."
