

Options for Seismic Strengthening of Church unveiled

After the AGM of the Friends of St Mary of the Angels Charitable Trust last Sunday our architects, Bulleyman Fortune, presented the preferred options for the seismic strengthening of the Church. The presentation was warmly received by the fifty or so people who attended.

The Restoration and Maintenance Committee are now busy preparing a submission to the Archdiocesan Board of Administration seeking approval to proceed to the preliminary design stage. The expenditure required to get these design drawings to the point where we clearly understand all the work that is required to strengthen the Church to over 100 percent of the current building code will be in the vicinity of \$250,000.

Please continue to pray for this very important project and pray that many benefactors will support us so that we and future generations can enjoy the beauty of St Mary of the Angels Church.



Reflection: A Journey in Humility

On Tuesday of this week, those who wish to find out more about Jesus and what the Catholic Church knows and teaches, will gather for an RCIA Enquiry Evening.

It will be for some, a significant step in a journey that takes them to the Easter Vigil, when they receive the Sacraments of Initiation into the Catholic Church: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

These RCIA candidates (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) are in for a blessed and fruitful experience, and though they may not know it, they are already a gift to our parish community, prompted by God to be here. Each candidate is supported by a Sponsor, who will accompany them at weekly meetings and learn as they do, something of what the Church teaches and how the Holy Spirit is present and active in each of us.

To Sponsor an RCIA candidate is to make an amazing journey of self-discovery. A Sponsor's own faith becomes transparent in the simple and natural process of accompanying another. A Sponsor is part of a community filled with experiences of God's love, not primarily an apologist or theologian. A Sponsor becomes a friend and mentor, able to share their faith, their insights and joys. Sponsors might remember that God will accomplish some particular work of Grace through them, whether they see it or not. What they will notice, is that by being a Sponsor they will be called into a deeper relationship with God.

The RCIA Leadership Team would truly welcome anyone who wants to consider joining this year's RCIA Group as a Sponsor, to make contact and to talk further.

Think about it, and take some time to reflect as St Paul suggests on the treasure held in clay jars. (2 Cor 4:7)
