Mission Sunday

Today is Mission Sunday. It is a day to celebrate and thank God for being a part of his mission. Each of us has been given an amazing gift, one that should not be hidden away. Rather we are called to share it with others. Although most of us are not called to go to far away missions in person, we can support the work of others who are working in the missions. We pray that by our support of those missions, our faith will continue to be a witness of a God who is present and working in various ways in our world today.



In his message for Mission Sunday this year, Pope Benedict XVI, wrote:

"I thank the Pontifical Mission Societies, instruments for cooperation in the universal mission of the Church across the world. Through their action, the proclamation of the Gospel not only bears witness to Christ but also becomes an intervention on behalf of one's neighbour, justice for the poorest, the possibility of education in the most remote villages, medical aid in isolated places, emancipation from poverty, the rehabilitation of the marginalized, support for the development of peoples, overcoming ethnic divisions, and respect for life in all its stages."

There are now 1250 Missionary Dioceses. They need financial support in order to live out the mission of the Church. The two particular projects that will be supported by New Zealander's this year are in the Republic of Kiribati and the Republic of Congo. They are described in more detail in the brochures included in the Angelus today. Please give generously this Mission Sunday so that the needs of the those less fortunate than us can be met.

Calendars for 2013 are now available for \$10 each from the Parish Office. They feature both beautiful religious art and Liturgical information.



Eucharistic Adoration

As Catholics, we believe in the Real Presence. That is to say, when the priest pronounces the words of consecration bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is the gift He gave to us at the Last Supper, in which we participate at every Sacrifice of the Mass.

While the graces we receive through worthy reception of the Eucharist are manifold, we also receive graces when we adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. In the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus asked the Apostles 'Could you not watch one hour with me?' (Matt 26:40). And so in Eucharistic Adoration we sit with Jesus, adoring Him, for whatever time we are able to give.

As we behold Jesus, "we receive and are transformed by the mystery we adore". Each experience of Adoration is different. When I have spent time in Adoration in the past, sometimes I have found it to be life transforming as He reveals the great love He has for me. Other times, I have found it to be a very quiet experience during which I sit and pray in His presence without any real sense of Him. And yet, the experience of Adoration is not why we pray before Him. It is because we love Him, and He loves us.

At St Mary of the Angels Parish we are blessed to have many opportunities be able to participate in Eucharistic Adoration. From Monday to Friday, there is exposition from 6.45am-7.30am and on Fridays there is also a Holy Hour from 11am-12noon. Once a month, St Mary of the Angel's Young Adult Catholics (SMAYACs) also have a holy hour (the third Thursday of the month at 6pm). Although it can be hard to find time to spend with the Lord, I have always found that the sacrifices made are richly rewarded.
