



Remembrance

When I call to mind one of my maiden aunts, along with her dramatic earrings and a penchant for unsuitable novels, the phrase "It is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead," comes to mind.

I remember her fondly and though she was technically my grand-aunt, being among my grandparents' generation, she seemed to occupy her own particular branch of the family tree that bent easily to include people of all ages.

November was definitely her month. For as many days during November as she could manage, she would, 'think of someone who had died and then, get along to Mass for them.' We know this because also in November, she would write to some part of the family she hadn't seen for a while, telling them when she was arriving for Christmas, with the suggestion that they 'don't go to any fuss on her account'. This latter instruction was somewhat misleading, since her coming for Christmas was not up for negotiation and her view of what constituted 'no fuss' set a powerful standard. And so it was that many of our family Christmases included this aunt. I have no clear memory as to how my parents reacted to the news she was coming to stay, but I remember how we loved the very idea of her and looked forward to having her with us.

When she died, there were surprisingly few stories of her nomadic life or her achievements. Instead, there emerged a realisation that her sense of family extended well beyond those of us directly related to her.

If her life could be characterised by anything at all, it is this: she had a gentle knack of drawing people to an uncomplicated experience of their faith and from there, into a sense of companionship with her and the faith she lived and loved.

Each year in November, the Parish Community at St Mary of the Angels gathers for a Mass of Remembrance for those who have died. It is a particular honour to be part of preparing the Liturgy for this Mass each year and to think about those whose earthly lives are completed. They remain an important part of our Church community and it really is 'no bother' to sit quietly with them, in Christ.
