

### Reflection

The story of the Korean Church is in every way a remarkable story. It is the story of a Church founded entirely by laypeople. It withstood wave after wave of persecution. In less than a century it could boast of 10,000 martyrs. Pope John Paul II canonized the Korean Martyrs on 6 May 1984.

On Friday evening there was great joy among the Korean community from St Mary of the Angels when Deacon Andrew Kim was ordained a priest by Archbishop John in the Cathedral. Deacon Andrew has been working this year in the Heretaunga Parish but has been a regular visitor on Sundays to the Korean community who are based here at St Mary of the Angels. Each Sunday after the 11am Mass the Korean community meet in the Parish Hall. They move from the Eucharist to continue their faith development through prayer, catechesis and song after which they have a shared lunch.

Father Andrew's ordination is a great day of celebration for the Korean community. We thank God for blessing them with one of their own as a priest. Father Andrew will celebrate his first Mass in the Korean language in our Church at 2.00pm this afternoon. While Father Andrew is a priest for the Archdiocese of Wellington and will be appointed to a Parish, he will, I am sure continue his association with the Korean community here and from time to time will be able to celebrate Mass for them.

Please keep Father Andrew and the Korean community in your prayer. They are both a great gift to the Archdiocese and to St Mary of the Angels Parish.
