



Congratulations

We warmly congratulate Krystine Tomaszyk who was awarded the Queen's Service Medal in the New Year honours list. Krystine was invited to come to New Zealand along with many other Polish children in 1944. Her story, like many others who came to make their home here is a remarkable one.

Krystine and her late husband Czeslaw (who died in 2011) were married in St Mary of the Angels on 31 December 1952 and together they raised two beautiful children. However, Krystine also found time to contribute back to the community who had welcomed her.

After completing a BA at Victoria University Krystine's professional life included Maori and Child Welfare, Marriage Guidance, Post-primary Teaching, Community Advice, a ministerial appointment as lay representative on the Waikato Medical Disciplinary Committee and the 'Waikato Woman of the Year' award by the Waikato Plunket Society.

Krystine has also written articles to various periodicals and has made contributions to a number of published books: 'Isfahan - the City of Polish Children (1987)', 'Refugees, Resettlement and Wellbeing (1989)', 'A bouquet of Thoughts and Reminiscences (1991)', 'But a Fleeting Moment - Meditations on the reality and the mystery of being (1997)'and she wrote her own book on her journey from Poland to New Zealand, 'Essence (2004)'.

Krystine is a faithful parishioner at the 11am Mass each week and we warmly congratulate her on this well deserved honour.

Focolare Movement

In today's Gospel we see Jesus going about his normal activities as a member of a community and of a family – he is happily at a wedding with his friends, and his mother is there too. When Mary notices that something needs to be done to solve a problem for the wedding couple, she confidently expects him to act and simply knows that he will, telling the servants to do whatever he tells them! And thus his first miracle is witnessed by those disciples who were there, enhancing their recognition of who this friend and leader really is.



Maria "Emmaus" Voce

This is like what happened in the Church in 1943, when a young teacher, Chiara Lubich, recognised the reality of Jesus in the Gospels, and the necessity of actually doing "whatever he told her, with her companions, to do" – i.e. putting His words into practice in their everyday lives. Their lives at the time were filled with the dangers and disruptions of wartime in their country, Italy. They saw that God, in fact, was the only unchangeable reality; and so they resolved to live primarily for him, together, in unity. Thus began what was to become a world-wide, active Movement, based in the Catholic Church but embraced by many from other churches and other religions.

This Movement, whose name, Focolare, translates as "hearth" or "fireside", is present today in 187 countries, where its members live a communitarian spirituality based on living out Jesus's words, especially "...that all may be one". It attracts families and people of all ages, everywhere – men, women, young adults, and children – who share the ideals of unity and universal "familyhood". It has been present in Aotearoa New Zealand since the 1970's; and there are two Focolare Centres in Wellington co-ordinating the Movement's life and activities around the country.



Since the death of the foundress, Chiara Lubich, in 2008, the movement has been led by Maria "Emmaus" Voce a well-known figure in the life of the Church, who recently participated in the Catholic Bishops' Synod on Evangelisation. She and the Focolare co-president, Giancarlo Falletti, will be in Wellington for meetings on Sunday 3 February at St Mary's College, Guildford Tce; from 3.00pm to 4.30pm for all interested; and from 5.30pm to 7.00pm particularly for young adults.
