



The Nicene Creed (2)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the second of our reflections on the Nicene Creed. "I believe ..."

In One God,...

The word "one" is an addition to the Apostles' Creed. In the midst of a culture that worshiped many gods (water, love, war, etc.), God revealed to Abraham and Moses that he is the one, true God. The Shema is the daily prayer of the Hebrew. It starts: "Hear O Israel, there is one God..."



... The Father ...

"Father" is the name that Jesus Himself used and gave to us for God. While using the word "Father" to refer to God may seem ordinary to the Christians of today, it was a unique concept in the early years of the Church.

- The Old Testament people did not even call out God's name.
- God was considered to be caring and protective, but Christianity teaches
 us a much more intimate relationship. We share in the unique
 relationship of Jesus to his heavenly Father whom he called "Abba,
 Father."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 239) says that by calling God "Father," the language of faith indicates:

- That God is the first origin of everything and is the unmatched authority.
- That God is at the same time goodness and has loving care for all His children.
- That God's parental tenderness can also be expressed by the image of motherhood, which emphasizes the closeness and intimacy between Creator and creature.
- That God surpasses the human distinction between man and woman. God is neither man nor woman: God is God. God surpasses both human fatherhood and motherhood, although He is their origin and standard.
- For us followers of Jesus, God is especially our Father who makes us His children through Baptism.

God is Father of the poor, of the orphaned and the widowed, who are under his loving protection (Psalm 68:5).
