



# **Religious Commitment**



# Reflection: The Nicene Creed (3)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the third of our reflections on the Nicene Creed. "I believe in...the Father almighty..."

# ...almighty...

Being "all-mighty" implies not only that God's power is greater than anything or anyone else's. It also means that it's universal/all-inclusive. for God who created everything also rules everything and can do everything.



#### ...maker of heaven and earth...

The expression "heaven and earth" means all that exists, creation in its entirety the universe. The earth, the universe, is the world of humans, while heaven is God's own place and the place of the spiritual creatures - the angels and saints who surround God.

All three persons of the Blessed Trinity created the world – "Creation is the common work of the Holy Trinity." CCC 292

What about evolution? Pope John Paul II speaking to the Pontifical Academy of Sciences 3rd Oct 1981 said:

"The Bible itself speaks to us of the origin of the universe and its make-up, not in order to provide us with a scientific explanation, but in order to state the correct relationships of humans with God and with the universe. Sacred Scripture wishes simply to declare that the world was created by God and in order to teach this truth it expresses itself in terms of the cosmology/science in use at the time of the writer... The Bible does not wish to teach how the heavens were made but how one goes to heaven."

So it is quite possible for religion and science to live together in harmony and there can be no ultimate contradiction. The source of truth is one and that source is God, the Father of Jesus Christ, in, through and for whom all things are created.

# ... of all things visible and invisible...

Catholics believe that God created the visible and invisible elements of the universe. Thus, God created everything. Some early sects, the Gnostics and Marcionites, believed that God the Father created the spirit world, but that an "evil" god (called the demiurge) created the similarly evil material world. The Church rejects this notion. Catholics believe God's creation, visible and invisible, is good.
