Reflection: The Nicene Creed (4)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the fourth of our reflections on the Nicene Creed. "I believe in...one Lord Jesus Christ..."

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ...

"Jesus" means "the Lord saves." It was significant that Jesus was given a human name, because it demonstrates His humanity. Jesus is fully human and fully God.

We've become accustomed to calling the Son of Man by the name "Jesus Christ,"

but in reality "Christ" is not a name, it's a title, a job description. "Christ" means "anointed." In the Old Testament, priests, prophets and kings were anointed with oil as a sign of being chosen by God. At His Baptism, Jesus was anointed, not by oil, but by the Holy Spirit who descended on Jesus in the form of a dove.

Jesus Christ is the Lord of all. The title "Lord" means that Jesus is master of all, and has connotations of deity, since the Hebrew word "Adonai" and Greek word "Kyrios" (both meaning Lord) were applied to God in the Old Testament. However, unlike many earthly rulers, Jesus is a friend to the oppressed and a servant of all.

The Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father from all Ages.

Begotten has the meaning of born, generated, or produced. God the Father is the unbegotten One.

God the Son is born out of the essence/nature of God the Father. Just as a human child shares the same humanity as his or her parents, so God the Son shares the same nature — divinity/God - with the Father. The Son is the Word/the image/the idea of self uttered by the Father. So the Son, Jesus Christ is called the Only-Begotten Son of God.

Since God the Father is eternal, without beginning or end, the Son, being begotten of God, is also eternal. Here we are not talking in terms of time. With God there is no such thing as time, so the Son is not younger than the Father. Both exist from all eternity, - together with the Holy Spirit.
