



Reflection: The Nicene Creed (7)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the seventh of our reflections on the Nicene Creed. "For our sake he (Jesus) was crucified under Pontius Pilate...,"

"For our sake"

The emphasis here is that Jesus' sacrifice was totally for us and totally within His power to give.

"...He was crucified..."

Jesus' death on the cross is the unique and definitive/ultimate sacrifice which surpasses all other sacrifices. It restores us to communion with God through "the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." Mt 26:28

- It is a gift from God the Father who handed his Son over to sinners to reconcile us with himself.
- Also, it is the offering of the Son of God made man, who in freedom and love offered his life to his Father through the Holy Spirit in reparation for our disobedience/sins. CCC 614

Why was Jesus crucified and not put to death in some other way? Crucifixion was considered the worst possible death - not only from the fact that it was long and painful, (death came as a result of suffocation), but also because the public humiliation was reserved for the worst of criminals. Regardless of the crime, Romans could not be crucified. For the Jews, crucifixion was a religiously abhorrent death, (cf Deuteronomy 21:23) let alone physically painful. And Jesus' reaction? "Father forgive them; they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34)

"...under Pontius Pilate..."

Why pick on Pilate?

- Wasn't it Herod the Great who tried to slay Jesus at birth, resulting in the slaughter of the innocents?
- Didn't Jesus come from Herod Antipas' territory of Galilee?
- Wasn't it Herod Antipas and his soldiers who mocked Jesus at His trial?
- Wasn't it the Pharisees who tried to trick Jesus at the trial?
- Wasn't it the High Priest who handed Jesus to Pilate, charging Jesus with crimes against Caesar?
- And didn't the people prefer Barabbas to instead of Jesus?

The answer is, that it was Pilate's decision which counted. He was the representative of Caesar. However, symbolically Pilate represents all of those, in times past and present, who have contributed to the passion and death of Jesus through sin -- that means you and me!
