

Vocation Sunday

This coming Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is always known as Good Shepherd Sunday. It is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The theme for this year is 'Vocations as a sign of hope founded in faith'. This is the 50th Anniversary of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations - a day to pray specifically for vocations to religious life and the priesthood. Pope Paul VI once said,

"Wherever numerous vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life are to be found, that is where people are living the Gospel with generosity."

For this Good Shepherd Sunday I am suggesting two things. Firstly, ASK yourself this question, "Am I living the Gospel with generosity? Am I attracting others to Jesus, enabling others to see what a privileged life we have as we witness to Christ?"

Secondly, PRAY. If this is a special day of Prayer for Vocations then pray especially for people to hear the call to follow Jesus as a priest or religious. Let's not just pay lip service and make sure that vocations are remembered in the Prayers of the Faithful. But everyone pray from their hearts.

Reflection: The Nicene Creed (8)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the eighth of our reflections on the Nicene Creed. "I believe in...Jesus Christ..."

"He suffered death..."

Jesus died on a cross, suffered as humans do, truly died, and was laid in a tomb. Despite what some critics will level against it, the Nicene Creed is more than just metaphysical/theoretical speculation. It includes important historical declarations.

In addition to being "true God from true God," Jesus is fully human as well. The early Docetists, named from the Greek word dokeo, "to seem," believed Jesus only seemed to be human, but was not, and simply went through the motions of being human. Thus, when Jesus ate, they said, he only pretended to eat. Docetism was a very early heresy, addressed by the Gospel of St. John (Cf Jn 20:27), as well as in St. Ignatius' letters in AD 110

e.g. 'Now, Jesus suffered all these things for our sakes, that we might be saved. And He suffered truly, even as also He truly raised up Himself, not, as certain unbelievers maintain, that He only seemed to suffer..."

"...and was buried,"

It was the Roman custom to allow relatives and friends to dispose of the body of a criminal. Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body and Nicodemus brought myrrh and aloes. Myrrh is a fragrant resin. Aloê is aromatic sandalwood in powered form. Both were used for perfume. They washed Jesus' body, mixed the spices with oil and anointed it, binding it in cloth. They laid it in an unused tomb hewn out of rock in the garden area near Calvary.

"...and rose again on the third day..."

The fact that Jesus rose on the third day might suggest 72 hours in the tomb. However the Jewish day went from sunset to sunset. Any burial had to be complete before the Sabbath began. The fact that sunset was approaching added a certain urgency to the burial. Also Deuteronomy 21:22-23 had to be considered. This required the body of an executed criminal to be buried before nightfall.

So Jesus was laid in the tomb late on Friday (Day one), was there all of Saturday (Day two) and He rose on Sunday (Day three).

We believe Jesus rose physically, living and glorified, from the dead. This belief is central to our Christian faith.

"...in accordance with the Scriptures."

This wording comes from 1 Corinthians 15:4. Jesus came to bring to fulfilment all the Old Testament scriptures which pointed to Him.
