

Vespers for the Feast of Pentecost

Tonight at 7.30pm we host our Christian neighbours, St Peter's Anglican Church and St John's Presbyterian Church for the beautiful liturgy of 'Vespers'.

The choirs will combine for the psalmody, the setting of the Magnificat by Buxtehude and for Mozart's Vespers setting of the psalm Laudate Pueri Dominum. The music will be accompanied by a string orchestra, lead by violinist Rebecca Struthers from the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra and Eleanor Carter will play continuo cello. The liturgy will last for about 50 minutes followed by a shared supper in the Parish Hall.

Reflection: The Nicene Creed (12)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the twelfth of our reflections on the Nicene Creed. "I believe in The Holy Spirit,..."

"...who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified,..."

The Holy Spirit is God as are the Father and the Son, and worthy of the same worship due to the Father and the Son.

"...who has spoken through the prophets."

It was the Holy Spirit that gave the prophets the grace and courage to speak the words of God. There were views at the time of the writing of the Nicene Creed that the Holy Spirit was not active in the world before the Pentecost. This is not true.

"I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church."

These are what are called the "Four Marks of the Church."

"One"

The Church is <u>one</u> because of her source: the three persons of the Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. One God.

The Church is <u>one</u> because of her founder: Jesus Christ who reconciled all people to God by the cross, uniting us in one body.



The Church is <u>one</u> because of her soul: It is the Holy Spirit, who brings about that communion of the faithful in Christ so that the Holy Spirit is the principle of the Church's unity.

The bonds of unity are:

- Charity which "binds everything together in perfect harmony." (Colossians 3:14)
- We all profess the one faith received from the apostles.
- The common celebration of divine worship, especially the sacraments.
- Coming from the apostles the sacrament of Holy Orders maintains unity.

Jesus established only one Church, not a collection of differing Churches. The tragedy and heartbreak of Christian disunity is something most Christian



denominations wish to heal. We recognise that many elements of sanctification and of truth are found in our sister Christian Churches, e.g. the written Word of God; the life of grace; faith, hope and charity with the other interior gifts of the Holy Spirit. All these blessings come from Christ and lead to him, and are in themselves calls to Christian unity.
