


## Reflection: The Nicene Creed (13)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the thirteenth of our reflections on the Nicene Creed. "I believe in one. holy, catholic and apostolic Church...."

#### ...holy...

By His grace, Jesus makes the Church holy. just as He, the Head, is holy. The Church itself is holy because it is the source of holiness and is the guardian of the special means of grace Jesus established, the Sacraments.



Our Lord Jesus Christ is holy and He has called us to holiness in Him, through His Body. We are called into communion with Him through the community of believers, by the Sacraments, by the preaching of the Gospel message, by praying and being prayed for, and by forgiving and being forgiven.

#### ...catholic...

The Church is catholic in the sense of being total and universal.

- It is total in that Jesus gave it the total means of salvation.
- The Church is catholic (universal) because she has been sent out by Christ on a mission to preach the Gospel to the whole of the human rac (Mt 28:19-20; CCC 830-856)

## ...and apostolic Church.

The Church traces its beginning/origin to the apostles.

- The Bishop of Rome (the Pope) is Saint Peter's successor.
- The bishops are the successors of the apostles, who were the witnesses chosen and sent on mission by Christ Himself.
- Under the Holy Spirit's guidance, the bishops preserve and proclaim the teachings handed on to them, assisted by priests in union with the successor of Peter, the Church's supreme pastor. CCC 857 – 862
