# Reflection: The Nicene Creed (14)

During this year of Faith we are looking at some of our Catholic beliefs. This is the fourteenth of our reflections on the Nicene Creed.

## I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins...

Our Lord tied the forgiveness of sins to faith and Baptism.

"He said to His apostles, 'Go into the whole world and proclaim the Good News to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:15-16)

- Baptism is the first and chief sacrament of forgiveness of sins because it unites us with Christ.
  - By his sin Adam, as the first man, lost the original holiness and justice he had received from God, not only for himself but for all humans. Adam and Eve transmitted to their descendants human nature wounded by their own first sin and hence deprived of original holiness and justice. This deprivation is called "original sin."
  - Baptism removes all sins, including Original Sin, and places an indelible mark on our soul, signifying that we are one of Christ's family.
  - The grace of Baptism does not deliver us from the effects of Original Sin – that is: a tendency to evil.
- As members of Christ's family, we can always approach Him and ask his forgiveness for personal sins.
- It is through the sacrament of Penance (Reconciliation) that the baptized can be reconciled with God and with the Church.
- There is no sin, however serious, that the Church, through the power of Christ cannot forgive.

If someone has been validly baptized in the name of the Trinity re-baptism is
