








Reflection: Lessons from children

A little shepherd boy was watching his sheep one Sunday morning and he heard the church bells ringing. Watching the people walking to church he thought, "I would like to talk with God, but what can I say to God?"

He had never learned a prayer. So, he knelt down and began to recite the alphabet. He repeated this several times. A man passing by heard the boy and looked to see what was



He interrupted the boy, "what are you doing?" The boy replied, "I was praying." Surprised, the man said, "but why were you reciting the alphabet?" The boy replied, "I don't know any prayers but I want God to take care of me and help me care for my sheep. So I thought, if I said all I knew God could put the letters into words and He would know all that I want and should say."

The man carried on to church, knowing that he wouldn't hear a better sermon that day.

Perhaps if we thought like little children and let God put the letters together about what we should want and what we should say, things might work out a lot better than we planned.

In his night prayer, the six year old stopped before his brother's name and said to his mother, "I don't think I'll ask God to bless Joe. He punched me in the nose today."

"But you've got to forgive your enemies. Jesus told us to," his mother reminded him.

"But," countered the little boy, "that's just the trouble: he's NOT my enemy. And that's why I can't forgive."

How true it is that it is harder to forgive one's friends than one's enemies.

A similar case happened in another family. The three children had gotten into a loud disagreement just before they went to bed. They were then aroused at two in the morning by a terrific thunderstorm.

Hearing an unusual noise from the bedroom, the mother went up to see what was going on. All the children were out of bed and hidden in the dark wardrobe. From inside, a little voice told her, "We're all afraid, and we're hidden here in the dark, forgiving each other."

God has forgiven us so much! Let's return the favour, especially to those nearest and dearest.
