



Update of Design Drawings for the Seismic Strengthening of St Mary of the Angels Church

In the Angelus of 5 May 2013 I informed parishioners that the design work for seismic strengthening of our beautiful Church had begun. I would like to give a brief update of progress.

Fee proposals for structural engineering, peer review engineering and architectural services have been agreed and signed and this work is well underway. A Fire Report has been completed. A conservation architect has been commissioned and is attending the fortnightly design meeting of all the parties involved in the project. The fee proposal for geotechnical investigations has been agreed and signed and work will begin this week.

This seismic upgrade of this magnificent Church to meet the modern building code is very complex and challenging. The building technology in 1919 was very different from today and over time deterioration in building materials has taken place. A Church as magnificent as this one must be preserved for the future and we only have one chance of doing it properly. This seismic design work comes after five years of study and contemplation by experts.

The Parish is so fortunate to have one of our parishioners, Brian McGuinness, of L T McGuinness Ltd managing this project. With his skill and leadership all those involved are working diligently towards the 'blueprint' to ensure the best possible result.

Of course it all comes down to \$\$\$\$. We have received a \$30,000 grant from the Wellington City Council towards the cost of design drawings. The amount required will be approximately \$250,000 to \$300,000. A special bank account 'Seismic Strengthening Account' has been se up to receive donations. All donations are tax deductible.

If you would like to make a donation specifically for this design work of 'seismic strengthening' it would be very much appreciated.

Please keep this project and those involved in your prayers. It is important to keep in mind that unless we undertake this work, we will not be able to continue using our beautiful Church.
