Music plays a big part in our liturgies at St Mary of the Angels. The Church itself is not only a beautiful building to be in, it is also wonderful to sing in, and our Maxwell Fernic organ is outstanding. There has been a choir here since the Church was founded in 1843, which makes us one of the oldest musical establishments in the country.

On Sundays there are three sung Masses in the Church. The 9am Mass has an informal group which leads the hymn singing, and sings the psalm. Our regular organist at that Mass is James Young. We would welcome more singers. Just turn up at 8:45, when we run through the hymns and practise the psalm. The congregation only needs to be encouraged and sings strongly.

The 5pm Mass has a singing group, ably led by Anne Hartley and Kathy Perreau, who plays the flute. The music is direct and informal, modern in style and we are always looking for instrumentalists, guitarists, people with keyboard skills and singers for that group. Congregation members often comment on how much they love the music. It doesn't happen without contribution: this could be you!! Again, just turn up at 4pm on Sundays, when the songs for that Mass are practised.

This year has been busy for the choir that sings at 11am Mass. Easter was early, and has the most demanding and the most inspiring music, followed by Paschal Time, with the great feasts of Ascension, Trinity, Pentecost and Corpus Christi. This year we hosted the Ecumenical Pentecost Vespers, joined by the choirs and congregations of St John's and St Peter's. A string orchestra, led by two members of the NZSO, accompanied Vespers music by Mozart and Buxtehude.

In addition the choir took part in a remarkable concert of exploratory sounds, called 'Radical Spirit'. Vocal improvisation, a throat singer, video art, taonga puoro, harpist, electronic sounds, plus the choir who performed music by the contemporary British composers James MacMillan and John Tavener. A big audience enjoyed a very 'different' event. And then the choir had its open day last Sunday! We too need more people. If you love singing, and would like to be part of any of these groups, contact me, or leave a message with the office. We'd love to have you.

Solemnity of St Peter and St Paul (29 June)

Veneration of the two great Apostles, Peter and Paul, has its roots in the very foundations of the Church. They are the solid rock on which the Church is built. They are at the origin of her faith and remain her protectors and her guides.

Peter's original name was Simon. Jesus gave him the name Cephas to show his role as leader of the apostles and the outstanding trait of his character. In Hebrew, Peter (Cephas) means the Rock. After the death and resurrection of Jesus, St. Peter came to Rome as bishop of the Christian community, and he died there as a martyr in 67 AD during the persecution of the Emperor Nero. He was buried on the Vatican hill where recent excavations have revealed his tomb in an old graveyard beneath the site of St Peter's Basilica.

Paul, known as Saul before his conversion, was born at Tarsus in the Roman province of Silicia. He was the son of Jewish parents who brought him up according to the strict religious beliefs of the Pharisees. A fierce opponent of the Christians, he was on his way to Damascus when the grace of God touched him and he converted in 34 AD to the faith he had been persecuting. After 20 years of zealous missionary activity, Paul was arrested by the Jews and sent for trial in Rome. He was condemned to death in 66 AD and beheaded on the site of the Basilica that bears his name.

St Augustine wrote (295 AD): "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labours, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith".

We thank God for the witness of the apostles Peter and Paul, and we give thanks for the gift of faith that comes to us from the apostles. We pray in a special way for our Holy Father, Pope Francis, successor of St Peter, that the Lord will give him wisdom and strength in his ministry of guiding the Universal Church.
