

"We need pastors not princes," says Pope Francis

"Bishops should be pastors who are close to the people, rather than ambitious clerics with the mindset of princes," Pope Francis told papal representatives tasked with putting forward candidates for episcopal appointments, writes Alessandro Speciale in Rome. "Be careful that the candidates are pastors close to the people, fathers and brothers; that they are gentle, patient and merciful; animated by inner poverty, the freedom of the Lord and also by outward simplicity and austerity of life; that they do not have the psychology of princess," the Pope said in an audience with Holy See's 108 papal representatives, together with 40 retired nuncios. Vetting potential bishops is one of the key tasks of nuncios and apostolic delegates. Francis stressed that intellectual prowess should not be the deciding factor in selecting future bishops. Scholars and theologians, he noted, are better put to different uses in the Church. "He is a great theologian, he is a brilliant mind: let him go to university, where he will do so well. Pastors, that's what we need," Francis said in his characteristically direct style.

"Shepherds need to be in front of their flocks to indicate the path, in the midst of the flock to keep them united, behind the flock to make sure none is left behind," he went on.

Francis quoted Pope John Paul II's advice to nuncios to root out episcopal candidates vying for the job: "The first criterion, volentes nolumus," he said. "We don't want those who want" to become bishops. The Pope hinted that rather than moving bishops from diocese to diocese to promote them, bishops should remain "the spouse of one Church, who is not constantly seeking another." "I will comment [further] about this when it is not being recorded," he added, as the nuncios erupted in laughter.

The two-day meeting with the nuncios was one of the events marking the Year of Faith.
