



The Visitation

Over the past couple of years I have twice read a book called 'The Visitation'. It is a book by Professor Rodney Grapes who lectured in earth sciences at Victoria University and the book is about 'the earthquakes of 1848 and the destruction of Wellington'. At that time Wellington had a population of about 3,000 people – sadly 3 people were killed and most of the brick and stone buildings in the city were either badly damaged or destroyed. Two severe aftershocks on 17 and 19 October (which followed the first 7.5 earthquake on 16 October) brought down those buildings which had been badly damaged. And of course the aftershocks continued for quite some time.

I originally brought this book because I liked the title: 'The Visitation'. It recalls for us as Catholics the visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth.

Last Sunday we had a 'visitation'. Not from Mary the mother of Jesus but from the natural forces of our earth. At the 7am Mass but especially at the 5pm Mass parishioners had a frightening experience in our 'earthquake prone Church'.

Today at all Masses I will be addressing all parishioners about the decisions that has been taken following the seismic events of last Sunday. As you know we are well down the track of design drawings and by the end of October we expect to have those design drawings completed.

I am confident that in faith and with generosity we can rise to this present challenge and ensure that St Mary of the Angels Church is preserved for generations to come.





Reflection: A Tentative Foothold

Wellington's earthquake weekend will be remembered for many reasons, but perhaps particularly by those who were gathered in a church during one of the heavy shakes. Offices and many businesses in the city were closed and the schools are enjoying holidays, but the churches were open and busy when some major tremors arrived.



There were moments of anxious hesitation during the 10.30am Mass at the Cathedral and St Mary of the Angels was evacuated when the 6.5 quake struck during the 5pm Mass. Because of the atmosphere of uncertainty, I decided to shorten the 7pm Cathedral Mass to a Liturgy of the Word with Communion and I caught a sense of relief and gratitude as people started for home earlier than usual.

The aftershocks have continued this week giving much more than a hint of the tentative foothold we have on the earth.

We are indeed tenants and our dwelling place is temporary. As tenants we are blessed with a most generous landlord who asks only that we take care of what has been given for our use. The responsibility of care is not burdensome but is often and easily avoided.

We find it in the Lord's Prayer: ... as we forgive those who... Forgiveness brings calm and creates peace. Resentment, bigotry and vengeance create disturbances more fearful than earthquakes.

Sincerely living our tenancy agreement will help us and help bring peace to the earth as well.
