



Reflection: The Grace of a long Lent

The closing of St Mary of the Angels has given us all pause for thought.

Undertaking huge tasks is not unprecedented in the history of St Mary of the Angels, but the situation we find ourselves in currently is new to us.

The work of getting on with the seismic strengthening is quite properly, the priority right now. It is a huge programme of work which carries with it great pressure on all those involved.

Alongside of this, the work of keeping our Parish community together is also a huge task. We appreciate that the initial activity of 're-housing' our core parish liturgies has already involved a huge amount of work and appears to be working well.

Now that we are past the initial reaction to the closure of our Church, we might consider the next 18 months or so, and reflect on what we need to do to keep our Parish community together.

Academics will tell us that engaging (connecting with and involving) [parishioners] during times of uncertainty is critical:

"If people have nowhere to take their grief, their hope, their discretionary effort, their enthusiasm and their joy – they will simply wander off and find somewhere else to make their home." (Kevin J Sensenig, 2009)

We have a home, we have the Holy Spirit and we have the Grace of a 'long Lent' ahead of us. If all goes well and the major work on the Church takes the expected 18 months, Easter 2015 may be the time when our Church community is reunited with our Church building. If we cast our minds forward to that Easter Vigil, we might imagine an experience of rejoicing and wonder, heightened by the hard work and spiritual travelling we have had to do to return to our familiar place of prayer. As we follow the Pascal candle into St Mary of the Angels, a community gathered once again, we might hear the Exultet quite differently, "Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people."

Until then, this 'long Lent' offers us time and plenty of scope for prayerful reflection. We have had already, many acts of hospitality shown us and there are kindnesses to come. We have the next 18 months or so to prepare, to re-think, to let go of what we no longer need, to accept new tasks and to learn new ways of working with each other. We are in good hands.
