

Feast of the Korean Martyrs

On Friday we celebrated the feast of the Korean Martyrs. The story of the Korean Church is unique because it was founded in the 18th century entirely by lay people. It withstood wave after wave of fierce persecution. In less than a century it could boast of 10,000 martyrs. The death of these martyrs became the leaven of the Church and led to today's splendid flowering of the Catholic Church in Korea.

The Korean Catholic community in Wellington is based at St Mary of the Angels. They are truly a wonderful example of faith as they meet each Sunday in our Parish Hall after Mass for catechesis and prayer. Each year during the month of January when our regular choir is on holiday the Korean community lead the singing at the Choral Mass.

There was great rejoicing last year when Father Andrew Kim was ordained for the Archdiocese of Wellington. Each month Father Andrew is available to celebrate Mass in Korean for the community.

We thank God for the witness of the Korean Martyrs and for the Korean community who are such a vibrant and generous group in our Parish.





Seismic Strengthening of Church

Planning continues for the preparation of design drawings for the Church. There is a tremendous effort being put in by our planning team and each week more information is gathered which will enable the correct decisions to be made about how best to bring the Church up



to the maximum NBS (new building standard) that we possibly can achieve. These decisions are not easy because we need to preserve the integrity of the Church. Planning consent requires the agreement of a heritage architect and the Historic Places Trust because the Church is a Category I Historic Place. However, progress has been good and hopefully by November we should be in a position to know how much the seismic strengthening will cost.

It is now very clear that the decision to close the Church was the correct one. After extensive x-ray and scanning of the columns, portals and walls the engineers agree that St Mary of the Angels Church is only between 15 and 20 per cent of the NBS. While the building has performed very well over the past 90 years we could not continue using it now that we know it's low rating in relation to the National Building Standard. It is very clear we need to strengthen the Church before it can be used again.

Over the past few weeks the major Parish Committee's have been meeting to discuss the best way to approach the major fundraising effort that will be needed. In due course we will inform parishioners of how we will manage this challenging task. Meanwhile we are receiving donations from generous benefactors so if anyone wants to make a donation to the seismic strengthening account they are very welcome. Just contact the Parish Office.

Please keep all these efforts in your prayers. This is the most challenging project undertaken by the Parish since the Church was completed in 1922. It can only be achieved through prayer and faith in Jesus Christ.
