





The Course on 'An Introduction to Christian Spirituality' will take a two week recess in October. The next course session is scheduled for Wednesday 16 October.



New Zealander wins 'Quiz on Korea'

We congratulate Michael Smith who recently won the 'Quiz on Korea' competition in Seoul. Michael is a New Zealander and is part of the Korean Community who meet in our Parish on Sundays.

Below is an extract from an article about Michael's success.

"A member of The Kiwi representative on a global quiz show has bought home the top prize, beating competitors from 29 other countries to win first place in the Quiz on Korea competition.



This was the first year a New Zealander had made it to the finals of the show, which is an annual event organised by the Korean government. The event is designed to promote Korean culture overseas. Contestants from 30 countries were flown to Korea for the final, which was aired at prime time on KBS television during Korea's biggest holiday, Chuseok (Thanksgiving Day).

In July, Michael Smith, a 33-year-old energy analyst from Wellington, won the right to represent New Zealand at the grand final in Seoul. ... After a tense battle, Michael secured the win by correctly naming the neo-confusion scholar depicted on the Korean 1,000 Won note.

"I had never even been to Korea before, so it's really unbelievable. A lot of the other contestants could speak fluent Korean so I didn't think I had much of a chance" explained Dr Smith. "But I had prepared well, studying Korean history and culture ..." he added.

Before returning home Dr Smith enjoyed his new found celebrity status on the streets of Korea, stopping for photos and signing autographs for his fans across the country. The Korean community in New Zealand is also especially proud that a local has won. "It was a big and wonderful news to our community and to the Korean people in Wellington" said Cecilia Kim, leader within the Korean community."
