Seismic Strengthening of St Mary of the Angels Church

The planning for the seismic strengthening of the Church continues at pace and significant results are being achieved by our consultants and experts. The work can be broken down into different facets and I will endeavour to give you an 'up to date' summary of each of these as follows:

Geotechnical

This covers the investigative works being carried out on the soil/rock on which the foundations of the Church are built. Several drill holes have been made deep into the ground under the Church up to depths of 25 metres. The results so far have indicated that further information is required, especially for soil/rock formations under the two 'towers'. These will be carried out in the next few weeks.

Structural/Architectural

Our engineers and architect have worked extremely hard to produce solutions so that we can strengthen the Church to as close to 100% of the New Building Code as possible. These solutions are all 'peer reviewed' to ensure we get the best possible result for the project.

Construction

Construction will take place in two stages:

All foundational work and the 'shear walls' Stage 1

Cost \$2.8 million Cost \$6.5 million Portals, Roof, strengthening of towers

Total \$9.3 million

Resource Consent has already been received and a Building Consent has been lodged with the Wellington City Council for work associated with Stage 1.

Fundraising

Our major fundraising effort will be launched in the next few weeks. We need to quickly raise 3 million dollars so that when Building Consent is received construction can begin on Stage 1. Everyone will be asked to help during this Fundraising Stage so please keep this in your prayers and ask God that many people will generously contribute to help strengthen our beautiful Church.





James MacMillan and the NZSO

The New Zealand Symphony Orchestra are presenting a special concert 'Hear & Far' on Saturday 9th May at 6.30pm at the Michael Fowler Centre.

Distinguished Scottish composer James MacMillan will conduct his own compositions: The Confession of Isobel Gowdie and Woman of the Apocalypse, as well as Lyrell Creswell's The Clock Stops.
