

#### Sea Sunday

Those who go down to the sea in ships, who do business on great waters; they have seen the works of the Lord and his wonders in the deep. [Psalm 107:23-24]

Today our prayers include those whose livelihood is from the sea. Such prayer should come naturally to New Zealanders; none of us live far from the sea and the ocean marks our borders. The first to live here came by canoe, the great wakas finding land after long, treacherous journeying through uncharted waters. Settlement and trade would not have been possible without ships and the skills to steer them safely.

Jesus lived by the inland sea of Galilee and much of his teaching was along the shore of that huge lake. He chose fisher-folk to witness his divinity and carry his message to the world. Apart from walking, the boat seems to have been his only means of transport.

We pray for those whose livelihood is from the sea. We pray for sailors who spend long periods away from their families and we remember today those who work in the ministry of the apostleship of the sea.
